INSURANCE/BEQUEST

At the most recent Board meeting, Rev. Mike Dixon presented a proposal for an insurance plan that will benefit FCC sometime in the future. He has now established a policy on his own life with FCC as the owner/beneficiary. This will pay FCC \$25,000 upon his death. The Dixons pay the annual premiums, so there is no cost to FCC. The agreement with the Board stipulates how the insurance beguest is to be Expenses, Outreach, used: Current Building/ Property, with the largest portion to go into the Permanent Fund to generate future income for the ongoing ministry of FCC. This is an opportunity to encourage FCC members and friends to establish your own plan of legacy giving. whether it be in your will, an annuity, an insurance policy, or some other means that will allow your giving and support to continue in the years to come. When asked, Rev. Dixon said "I've wanted to do this since I first learned it was possible: now we are in a position to make it happen. I'm glad we did and hope others will, too. Imagine the difference it will make for those who come after us."
