GOD SURPRISES

Have you had any strange dreams lately? Dreams are intriguing. Their cause can be from too much pizza...to God. THAT'S RIGHT! God can speak to people in their dreams.

One man who experienced such a dream was Jacob. Check out his dream and story in Genesis 28:11-22. Let's just focus on verses 12 and 13, "And he dreamed, and behold a ladder set up on the earth and the top of it reached to heaven; and behold the angels of God ascending and descending on it. And, behold the Lord stood above it, and said, I am the Lord God of Abraham your father, and the God of Isaac: the land whereon you lie, to you I give it, and to your seed."

Note the phrase BEHOLD and let's focus on it briefly.

<u>Behold a ladder</u>. Here is a surprising union. Heaven and earth joined. God was in touch with man. And Jacob was learning that the connection could be made anytime, anywhere. Not just back home, where Papa Isaac and Mama Rebekah prayed around the family altar, but also amid the rocks and sand of the desert.

Jacob could not reach God, but God could reach him. Jacob had no ladder for climbing up to heaven. His works could never gave him access to God. But God had a ladder for reaching down to earth. He made the linkup on His own initiative. He is the God who is gracious to sinners.

Friends, the ladder still stands. The name of the ladder is Jesus. Jesus said, "Verily, verily, I say unto you. Hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man" (John 1:51). Jesus is the union between God and man. No man comes to the Father except by Him. "There is one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus (I Timothy 2:5).
