What manner of love! **It's a conquering love.** Look at verse 8: "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested that he might destroy the works of the devil." The cross was love's duel with sin. There Jesus judged sin, defeated sin, abolished sin. When we yield to His love, sin's power is broken in our lives, and we are transformed by His love.
