WHY READ THE BIBLE? (Part Two)

"But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law does he mediate day and night." (Psalm 1:2)

Today we continue Part 2 of our thought, "Why Read The Bible?"

Some, however, like the Psalmist, read the Bible joyfully. It is their meat and drink. In it they hear God speak, and their fellowship with God is enlightened and deepened.

The wise Christian reads the Bible to commune with God. He reads to learn of Jesus. The Scriptures, Jesus once said, "testify of me" (John 5:39). They should be read to keep life genuinely Christian.

According to this Psalm, a right use of the Word does three things: **First, it keeps life clean.** The man who delights in the teaching of God will avoid "the counsel of the ungodly," "the way of sinners," and "the seat of the scornful" (v.1). **Second, it makes life fruitful.** The Word-soaked man is like a well-watered tree, producing a good harvest of fruit. "And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water that brings forth his fruit in his season." (v.3) The Christian who really believes and practices the Bible will become increasingly Christlike. **Third, it prepares life for judgment.** The righteous man will stand when the ungodly falls, "for the Lord knows the way of the righteous; but the way of the ungodly shall perish" (v.6).

Read the Word of God. Do not read it as a religious charm, nor as a dreary duty. Do not read it in a negative spirit. Read it to hear God speak to your heart. Read it to get acquainted with Jesus Christ. Read it to give power and purpose to your life.
