WHY READ THE BIBLE?

Each New Year we often are challenged to read the Bible through in the year ahead. Well here we are 2024 and a great opportunity lies ahead to read the Bible through this year. There are all kinds of plans to select even devotional books that provide a daily guide for reading plans.

Why read the Bible each day of the year. In this devotion let's talk about why we read it. In God's sight motive counts for more than action.

Jesus reproved the Pharisees for doing good things for bad reasons, such as praying to be heard of men and giving alms to be praised by men.

Read Psalm 1 verse 2 which describes the blessed man, "But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law does he mediate day and night."

Law is more than statutes, more than the Ten Commandments. It means "teaching" all that God says in order to save our souls and direct our lives. For us, it is the whole Bible, and needs to have a place in our thinking day and night.

Some people read the Bible "superstitiously". Just as an apple a day is suppose to keep the doctor away, they seem to think a chapter a day from the Bible keeps the devil away. So they read a prescribed amount, not meditating on it, nor listening to it, not applying it to their lives, just skimming through it to get it over with.

Some read the Bible "dutifully". They don't desire it, they don't delight in it, but it's something Christian people ought to do so they grudgingly do it. They resolve to do it, and they set out with fierce determination and patient resignation to do it. Very few keep it up.

Some read the Bible "critically". They look for faults. They pore over the Bible in a determined search for errors, contradictions, and discrepancies. When they think they have spotted some, they publicize them with glee. They have made themselves judges of the Word, refusing to allow the Word to judge them.


