PASTORS CORNER Part 1 – A Look Back

As we near the end of 2025, I've been reflecting with a heart full of gratitude for all that God has done in and through our church this year. I know life, especially this time of year, is busy. But when you pause long enough to look back, you realize just how much life, ministry, and kingdom impact has taken place.

This year, we worshiped together, grew together, served together, and stepped boldly into our community with the love of Christ. Our worship and teaching life carried us through a rich and meaningful journey—beginning the year with an overview of the Gospels, moving into a powerful Lenten series on faithfulness through the book of Daniel, walking together through deeply moving Holy Week and Easter services, celebrating all summer long with our Summer Playlist sermon series, exploring the Parables of Jesus this fall, leaning into our Time, Talent, and Treasure stewardship series, and now celebrating Advent together. Week after week, God has been faithful, and it has been a joy to grow together in understanding, commitment, and discipleship.

Inside our own church family, we saw God at work in countless quiet and meaningful ways. We cared for one another through meal trains, cards, prayers, visits, and fellowship, and supported those walking through grief and hardship through ministries like GriefShare. Our Pastor's Bible Study and Sunday School classes helped deepen relationships and spiritual formation. We shared Valentine care packages with our seniors and shut-ins, reminding them how deeply they are loved. All throughout the year, the church continued to be the church—bearing one another's burdens, showing compassion, and strengthening the bonds that hold our congregation together.

Beyond our walls, we served our broader community with joy. We marched in the Shrine Parade and the Honeybee Festival Parade, participated in Scare on the Square, and helped in the Hospitality Tent at the fair. We supported local families through the Soup Kitchen, Food Pantry, and Clothing Closet, and we extended compassion through benevolence and acts of kindness that most people will never even hear about. Our annual Christmas in July offering helped support families in Texas recovering from devastating floods, showing once again that FCC's love stretches far beyond city limits.

We also continued our strong commitment to our local schools—providing socks for preschoolers, books for 1st graders, math flash cards for 3rd graders, and shoes for families in need during Holy Week. We loved being part of Homecoming week at the high school while hosting Lunch on the Lawn, encouraging students and staff and reminding them that their community and our church is cheering them on.

Our investments in the next generation continued to flourish. Through God's Gang, Sunday School, and our growing Club 3–5 youth group, we watched our children and young people learn, serve, and grow. We celebrated a wonderful class of graduating seniors and awarded thousands of dollars in scholarships to support their futures. And of course, we hosted another incredible Vacation Bible School, filled with music, laughter, crafts, lessons, and the good news of Jesus shared in joyful and memorable ways.

Woven through all of this was the gift of fellowship—life-giving moments that knit us together as a family. We enjoyed a summer of fun with our pool party, church picnic, family bowling night, Tailgate Sunday, trivia night, and all the smaller moments of joy shared before and after worship each week. These gatherings reminded us that Christian community is not only about serving and learning, but also about celebrating, laughing, and simply enjoying the gift of being together.

The list could go on and on—but it is so important to pause and honor the incredible, faithful, Christ-filled ministry that took place this past year. Thank you, church, for being the church!!!

SPLINTER FROM THE BOARD

Date: November 11, 2025

Attendance: 19 members present (16 voting)

Senior Minister's Report: Fall Bible Study and Grief Share have been going well and will take a break for the holidays. Our fall sermon series on the Parables was well received, and Advent planning is well underway. Pastor Isaac continues to care for the congregation through counseling, visitation, and participation in both church and community events.

Youth Director's Report: Faith continued to finish her time here well, ensuring a smooth transition as she steps down from the role of Youth Director. The celebration of her ministry has been moved to January due to Stevie's earlier-than-expected arrival. Faith preached her final sermon on October 5th.

Treasurer's Report: The General Fund remains healthy with a balance of \$287,854.91. While giving still trails expenses overall, the gap has narrowed significantly over the past two months.

Christian Education: A motion passed to use the payout from the Hasler Children's Fund to support God's Gang.

Community Outreach: Mary K. Bradford and Donna Moody will once again chair the committee in 2026, continuing their excellent work in the community.

Evangelism: The team was active this fall—walking in the Honeybee Parade, participating in the first Potterfest, and joining Scare on the Square.

Membership: The committee hosted the Pastor Appreciation Breakfast on October 12th and Trivia Night on November 7th. They will also host Faith's reception (now scheduled for January) and the annual “Birthday Cake for Jesus” on December 21st.

Staff Relations: A task force was approved to revise the Youth Director job description and explore the possibility of dividing the position into two roles—Kids Director and Youth Director—to best serve the church in the coming years. Sammy's hourly pay was increased from \$17.00 to \$18.50 following successful completion of her onboarding period. A staff Love Offering will once again be collected and distributed on December 21st.

SPLINTERS CONTINUED

Stewardship & Finance: The proposed 2026 budget was presented and approved with a minor adjustment. It will now move to the congregation for final approval.

Worship: Plans are in place to decorate the sanctuary for Christmas.

Investment Fund: As of October 1st, the church has \$1,480,647.61 invested. Funds continue to perform well, and efforts are underway to improve clarity around distributions and disbursement guidelines.

Trustees: A change in our phone carrier will result in significant annual savings. A new service provider will also oversee the dedicated elevator phone to ensure state compliance.

New Building Fund: Updated cost estimates were received for potential new construction: \$2 million to build and attach to the back of the church. \$750,000 to build on the property across the street. A motion passed to use New Building Funds to purchase full architectural blueprints for the building across the street.

CWF: The Giving Tree is once again on display, inviting members to purchase gifts or give their time to bless residents in assisted living facilities and FCC members at Brookstone.

Additional Business: A Committee Charter Task Force was approved to update all committee charters based on current needs and feedback. The 2026 leadership slate was presented and approved and now moves to the congregation for a vote on December 14th. Bill Moss requested increased transparency in the monthly Treasurer's Report; this is now reflected in the Messenger.
